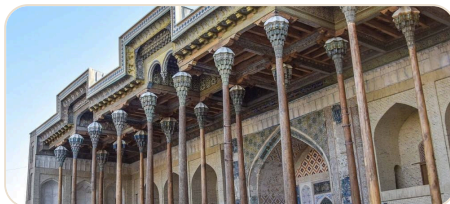
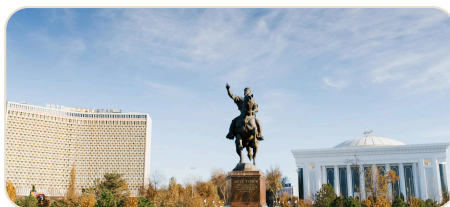
Overview

Uzbekistan Silk Road Classic is an 8-day journey through the country's most iconic historic cities: Tashkent, Khiva, Bukhara and Samarkand. The route is designed for travelers who want to see the essential Silk Road highlights in a compact and comfortable program.

The tour begins in Tashkent, Uzbekistan's modern capital, then continues by domestic flight to Khiva, a preserved old city surrounded by fortress walls. From there, the journey moves to Bukhara and Samarkand, two legendary Silk Road centers known for madrasahs, minarets, mausoleums, bazaars and traditional craft heritage.

This program is suitable for first-time visitors to Uzbekistan who enjoy cultural sightseeing, walking tours, historic architecture and well-organized logistics. Domestic flights and train travel help connect the main cities while keeping the route efficient.

Itinerary

DAY 01

Arrival in Tashkent

Arrive in Tashkent and meet your driver at the airport. Transfer to the hotel and check in according to hotel policy. The rest of the day is free to relax after your flight, take a short walk nearby or prepare for the start of your Uzbekistan Silk Road journey.

DAY 02

Tashkent City Tour – Flight to Urgench – Khiva

Begin your guided tour of Tashkent, a capital where old neighborhoods, Soviet-era avenues and modern public spaces come together. Visit key city highlights such as the Courage Monument, the Old City area, Khast-Imam surroundings, Chorsu Bazaar, selected Tashkent Metro stations, the Museum of Applied Arts, Alisher Navoi Theatre exterior and Amir Timur Square. In the evening, transfer to the domestic airport for the flight to Urgench. Upon arrival, continue by road to Khiva and check in at the hotel.

DAY 03

Khiva Old City Tour – Flight or Transfer to Bukhara

Spend the day exploring Khiva's Ichan-Kala, a compact walled city and one of Uzbekistan's most atmospheric Silk Road sites. Walk through narrow lanes lined with madrasahs, mosques, minarets and palace courtyards. Sightseeing may include Kunya-Ark, Juma Mosque, Kalta-Minor Minaret, Tash-Khovli Palace, Pakhlavan Makhmud Mausoleum and Islam Khodja Minaret. Later, transfer to Urgench for the onward flight to Bukhara, or travel by train or road if flight schedules require a change.

DAY 04**Bukhara Walking Tour**

Discover Bukhara on a guided walking tour through the old city, where many monuments are located close to one another. Visit Lyabi-Hauz Ensemble, Magoki-Attori Mosque, Chor-Minor, the traditional trading domes, Kalyan Minaret, Kalyan Mosque, Miri-Arab Madrasah, Ulugbek and Abdulazizkhan madrasahs, Ark Fortress, Bolo-Khauz Mosque, Ismail Samani Mausoleum and Chashma-Ayub. In the evening, enjoy local atmosphere in the old town, with an optional cultural show or dinner depending on the final program.

DAY 05**Bukhara Surroundings – Drive to Samarkand**

Continue sightseeing around Bukhara with visits that may include Sitorai Mokhi-Khosa, the former summer residence of the last emir of Bukhara, the Bakhouddin Naqshbandi memorial complex and the Fayzulla Khodjaev House Museum. In the afternoon, depart for Samarkand by road. On arrival, check in at the hotel and rest after the journey.

DAY 06**Samarkand City Tour**

Explore Samarkand, one of the greatest cities of the Silk Road and a symbol of Timurid architecture. Visit Registan Square, Gur Emir Mausoleum, Bibi Khanum Mosque, Siab Bazaar and Ulugbek Observatory. The afternoon may include free time to enjoy the city at your own pace, return to a favorite monument or relax at a local café.

DAY 07**Samarkand Sightseeing – Train to Tashkent**

Continue your Samarkand discovery with Shakhi-Zinda Necropolis, Afrasiab Museum and the Tomb of Saint Daniel. Later, visit Konigil village to learn about traditional Samarkand paper-making from mulberry bark. After lunch or free time, transfer to the railway station and take the train back to Tashkent. Upon arrival, transfer to the hotel.

DAY 08**Departure from Tashkent**

Check out from the hotel and transfer to Tashkent International Airport according to your flight schedule. This concludes your Uzbekistan Silk Road Classic tour through Tashkent, Khiva, Bukhara and Samarkand.

FAQ

Is this tour suitable for first-time visitors to Uzbekistan?

Yes. This route includes the most famous Uzbekistan highlights: Tashkent, Khiva, Bukhara and Samarkand. It is a strong classic itinerary for travelers visiting the country for the first time.

Is the tour private or group-based?

The program can be offered as a small group or private tour depending on your preferred dates, budget and availability. The final format is confirmed after inquiry.

Are domestic flights always included?

The standard route uses domestic flights for long-distance sections such as Tashkent–Urgench and, when available, Urgench–Bukhara. If flights are unavailable or schedules change, the route may be adjusted by train or road transfer.

How much walking is involved?

Most sightseeing days include several hours of walking, especially in Khiva, Bukhara and Samarkand. The pace is moderate, with stops for photos, explanations and breaks.

Do I need a visa for Uzbekistan?

Visa requirements depend on your nationality. Many travelers can enter Uzbekistan visa-free, while others may need an e-visa or consular visa. We will advise you based on your passport and travel dates.

Can the itinerary be customized?

Yes. Extra nights, hotel upgrades, private guiding, extensions to the Aral Sea, Aidarkul Lake, Penjikent or other destinations can be added on request.
